**2019 Honored Old Timer
 Gordy Jones**

From the time he was a toddler, Gordy Jones was rarely seen without a glove, bat, or a ball. His dad, a baseball addict as well, would often pitch to and play catch with young Gordy from about the time he was three. Soon Gordy would be bicycling about town trying to find a "pick-up" game, as kids would play on those warm summer days in St. Paul in the 60s. He joined some organized Park & Rec teams, but he enjoyed the flexibility of the pick-up games. It allowed him to meet other baseball kids in all of neighborhoods around St. Paul. As he grew into his teens, it also allowed him the flexibility to caddy and earn cash, much of it used for going to Met Stadium and watching the Twins. He and his dad had been fans and had gone to games since 1961, but now he was going on his own to root for Killebrew and the boys.

As a young man he was employed by the Pioneer Press as a courier. Gordy's gift of gab brought him many friendships at the paper. Before long he was being mentored by some of the finest writers and photographers in journalism. Soon he was writing entertainment stories and shooting photos for the evening St. Paul Dispatch. He enjoyed that, but his dream was to work in baseball.

In 1977, Gordy took a job at a newspaper in Southern California. He was writing a story for the paper as he traveled to LA, and by chance, he ran into his pal Dave Winfield in Kansas City. Dave invited him to dinner that night. He was one day out of St. Paul, and already found himself dining with some of baseball's stars; Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Dave Winfield. Over dinner, Dave spoke of a children's charity he was founding in California as he played for the Padres. He asked Gordy if he was interested in doing some photography for him. Gordy began photographing and volunteering at the kid's charity events, and at times drove Winfield to some of his many public appearances at schools, hospitals, or luncheons, and occasionally he would go to road games. The Winfield Foundation was expanding and doing events in all Major League cities. When Dave spoke to a group, Gordy absorbed every word he said. It was always a fun, positive, message full of values. It later became useful information, as Gordy instilled Dave's ideas into his own Children's book, The Baseball Guy. Gordy also incorporated Dave's ideas into the many school visits he's done, and continues to make today.

After six years in California, Gordy was offered a job at home, back at the Pioneer Press. After returning to Minnesota, Minnesota Twin Kirby Puckett asked Gordy to photograph some charity events that he had been planning. Gordy wanted to give back to the community. He also began coaching youth sports, but his work in photography and marketing for charitable events was catching on. Soon Gordy received similar requests for help from Harmon Killebrew, Tony Oliva, Michael Cuddyer, Joe Mauer, John Gordon, Denard Span, Justin Morneau, Matt Blair, Mike Singletary, Marty Springstead, MLB umpires, among others. Many of these personalities became close friends. The year that Gordy's father died, Harmon Killebrew -- a man who Gordy and his dad loved and watched together during the Killer's amazing career -- invited Gordy to spend Christmas with him. That was when Gordy fully realized that he was a blessed man.

In 2001, Winfield and Puckett were inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame. Gordy went along as their personal photographer. In 2001, he became a Minnesota Twins game-day employee, being employed for eight years in Guest Services and in the Ticket Office. In 2003, Gordy created a self-syndicated column called Twins Talk, which in its hey-day, appeared in 25 midwestern newspapers. As newspapers found tough times, Gordy sold his column to radio websites, including the CBS Radio website.

In 2006, Gordy wrote and published a children's book, The Baseball Guy. In its two editions, it has raised more than \$5,000 for child-related charities. Gordy has visited more than 100 schools and senior-care centers, where he reads his book and, through fun baseball stories, he shares the positive messages that he learned from Dave Winfield long ago. Today Gordy continues to write and shoot pictures for baseball, golf, boxing, and charitable fundraising events. Gordy is also the official photographer for the Minnesota Boxing Hall of Fame.
