Sauk Rapids, Centennial and Sauk Rapids advanced.

Eden Prairie earned a spot in the championship game by sweeping through the first three days of the double elimination tournament without a loss. In the late game on Thursday night, Eden Prairie defeated Sauk Rapids, the surprise entrant in the final three contenders, by a score of 10-5.

## Home crowd goes home happy

Sauk Rapids, the Cinderella team of the 2011 State American Legion Baseball Tournament, couldn't make the glass slipper fit in a 10-5 loss to Eden Prairie in the winners' bracket final Sunday night at Round Lake Park Stadium.

Eden Prairie was dominant in winning its fourth straight game at State. The host team outhit Sauk Rapids 14-5 and had only one miscue in the field.

Second baseman Tony Skjefte hammered a long home run and went four-for-five with four RBI in his best tournament game to date. Teammate Ryan Maenke, who plays third base, went three-for-five. Blake Schmit, David Belusky and Danny Blasy added two hits apiece for the winners.

Skjefte talked about his home run after the game.

Eden Prairie will play in the championship game at 1 p.m. at Round Lake Stadium. In the 10 a.m. game, Sauk Rapids will play Centennial for a chance to advance.



The World Series will be held in Shelby, N.C., beginning Aug. 12.

When Eden Prairie was awarded the 2011 State American Legion Baseball Tournament 18 months ago, co-chairs Stacy Skjefte and Bob Buteyn couldn't wait to get started.

This week's State Tournament is the results of months of hard work and preparation. And it represents the work of many volunteers.

"So many people in the community went above and beyond the call of duty to make it happen," Bob said in an interview Sunday.

"American Legion Baseball gets in your blood," said Stacy, who has watched her sons Luke (2007) and Tony (2010) represent Eden Prairie in the American Legion World Series. "It is such an honor for me and my family to be involved in American Legion Baseball and the Eden Prairie Baseball Association [EPBA]."

"It is an honor for me to be entrusted to cochair this tournament," said Bob. "I took my son to tee ball for the first time when he was 5 years old. Now he's 25 and he's one of the coaches for the American Legion team. I've gotten more out of the program than I could ever put into it."

When they formed the committee and the various subcommittees for the State Legion Tournament, Stacy and Bob enlisted the help of trusted friends in the community. Linda Peterson, mother of Eden Prairie Legion first baseman Tyler Peterson, served as chairman of the tournament program subcommittee. Chelle Grunewald served as banquet chair. Scott Soderberg led the concessions effort and Dave Miller coordinated scorers and announcers.

Mari Bray, mother of EP pitcher Adam Bray, was the official photographer for the tourney took photos of all 16 qualifying teams.

State American Legion Baseball Director Darwin Berg is pleased with Eden Prairie's performance as the host community. "You could see there was a lot of planning involved in the tournament," he noted. "The people we've worked most closely with, Stacy and Bob, are always available, always willing to help."

Darwin said cooperation and efficiency were not limited to the co-directors.

"The Marriott Hotel was very accommodating," he said. "We've been happy with the fields and the grounds crew has been great. The banquet was a gala affair. In my time, it's the largest banquet we have ever had for an American Legion Baseball State Tournament. And it came off without a hitch."

"My expectation was to have the best banquet and the best state tournament we could possibly have," said Stacy. "Our volunteers are the reason we have been successful this week. We have great people working on the tournament."

In addition to the volunteers, the host committee is grateful to 36 sponsors that have stepped up to the plate with financial support.

When EP first baseman Tyler Peterson saw

Stacy at the end of the tournament banquet, he praised her and asked, "What can we do to repay you?"

"Just win," said Stacy.

If Eden Prairie finishes first or second in the State Tournament, Stacy will go on the road with the team and other EP parents for the regional in Dickinson, N.D. Aug. 4-8.

When she isn't volunteering for Legion Baseball, Stacy is an account executive for Cigna Health Care.

Bob manages a warehouse for American Paper Supply when he isn't at the ball field.

There is a lot of volunteerism behind the scenes that most people don't see. Bob has done a lot of work on the Eden Prairie High School Baseball Field, which was used as one of four tournament fields.

"One Sunday, the grounds crew saw Bob up at the high school field and wondered why he was pulling weeds," said Stacy.

Speaking of the grounds crew, the tournament would not be running smoothly without their efforts.

"The goal was to make the fields perfect," said Stacy.

"A facility like Round Lake Stadium gives us the chance to do a tournament like this with confidence," said Bob. "This is year 3 for the stadium."

"The American Legion team and all of the teams in the Eden Prairie Baseball Association take pride in playing at Round Lake Stadium," Stacy added.

pitch, and I jumped on one," he said.

Skjefte was quick to take the emphasis off of himself and put it on the team.

"We all go up there to hit with a good approach," he said. "And we've been executing well. We're solid throughout the lineup ... and we have a little bit more power than we had last year. We hit 28 home runs [in 2010] and we have 45 this year."

Maenke has had two great games in a row at the plate, according to EP head coach Scott Hackett.

"Ryan is swinging a hot bat," said Hackett. "Different guys are stepping up every game. I feel comfortable with everyone in the batting order, and we also have guys coming off the bench who can swing the bat."

"I saw a lot of fastballs tonight," said

Maenke. "I tried to go the opposite way, and I had two hits to the left side."

Thonvold, a two-way player who is equally solid as a pitcher and a hitter, closed Sunday night's game in style. He fanned the side in the top of the eighth inning and retired three of four Sauk Rapids hitters in the ninth.

"A lot of guys are stepping up for us right now," he said. "Everyone comes to do his job ... we have a lot of depth on the pitching staff and throughout the lineup, 1-9."

Coach Hackett complimented Sauk Rapids. "They come to battle," he said. "And they can swing it. I knew we had to be ready on the mound. They got a few hits, but we did a good job of minimizing their opportunities."

Eden Prairie, which was ranked No. 1 in the final Legion State poll, is on the verge of showing everyone that the rankings were correct.
