## Eight teams reach the third day of tournament

In this year's new format, more teams are staying in the tournament longer. Eight teams will still be in the hunt for the 2012 Division I American Legion Baseball title on Sunday.

Action will continue at Chaska Athletic Park and Chanhassen High School.

The two 10 a.m. games will feature New Ulm Gold vs. Lakeview North at Chaska and

Tri-City Red vs. Eden Prairie at Chanhassen.

The 1 p.m. games will feature outstate heroes Grand Rapids and Winona at Chanhassen and the battle of the unbeatens, Burnsville and Edina, at Chaska.

The two later games at Chaska, slated for 4 p.m. and 7 p.m., will be those fighting through the losers' bracket.

The semi-final game on Monday will be at Chaska at 11 a.m. and the championship game will be at 1 p.m.

The two finalists will both advance to the Regional Tournament at Dickinson, N.D.

At the Division II Tournament in Sacred Heart, Plato and Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton will play for the championship game on Sunday. Ely will play Stewartville in the third place game of the single-elimination tournament.

In action Saturday, Eden Valley-Watkins won the consolation title.

### Waite Park Silver Stars go for the gold

Good pitching and fundamental baseball helped the Waite Park Silver Stars to a 4-3 win over Hopkins in an elimination game Saturday afternoon at Chanhassen High School.

Right-hander Josh Wood pitched a complete game, allowing 12 hits. Reese Gregory delivered the winning run with a bases-loaded single in the bottom of the ninth inning. After the game, the Silver Stars rushed to engulf Gregory.

"With bases loaded and one out, my job was to get the ball to the outfield," said Gregory after the game. "I was happy to come up with a man on third because I had

# Grand Rapids squeezes one home, 10-9

In a game that featured a total of 30 hits, the outcome was decided with a bunt Saturday afternoon at Chaska Athletic Park.

With the score tied 9-9 in the bottom of the tenth inning, Grand Rapids runner Grant Carlisle broke for the plate. His teammate, David Liebe, bunted the ball toward first base and Carlisle beat the toss to Winona catcher Zach Benson for the game winner.

"Talk about emotions," said Grand Rapids head coach Bill Kinnunen after the game.

Rapids gave up two runs in the top of the tenth, but came out hitting in the bottom of the tenth. Jake Bischoff walked to lead it off. Reid Holum doubled. After Winona recorded an out, Carlisle, Billy Hammann and Tyrel Cournoyer hit consecutive singles to set the stage for the winning bunt play.

"I had been in that position before," said Liebe, who hits ninth in Grand Rapids' order. "We practice bunting a lot, and I wasn't surprised when Coach Kinnunen put the play on. I saw that the third baseman was in pretty close, so I figured my best chance was to bunt toward first. I got a lucky hop."

"I was hoping to God that David wouldn't take the pitch," said Carlisle. "David bunts a lot, so I was confident he could get it down. Running toward the plate, I felt like I was on thin ice ... I had to step over the catcher's glove to get in."

"Winning this one was a great feeling, especially since this is my last year of Legion ball," said Liebe. "We aren't ready to go home."

Saturday's win raised Grand Rapids' season record to 22-11. Both Carlise and Liebe said

# Burnsville Cobra pitcher wraps up a big victory

The Burnsville Cobras have become one of the top programs in State American Legion Baseball during Greg Nesbitt's eight years as head coach.

Burnsville was ranked No. 1 in the state for most of the year in the state Legion poll, and the Cobras improved to 32-5 overall by beating Tri-City Red in the state winners' bracket semifinals Saturday at Chaska Athletic Park. The Cobras are poised to face Edina in the winners' bracket final at 7 p.m. Sunday.

In their victory over Tri-City Red, the Cobras scratched out two unearned runs. Lefty Bo Hellquist pitched a gem against one of the best hitting teams in the state, while Joe

they love playing for Coach Kinnunen.

"Bill knows what he's talking about," said Carlisle. "He has a strong baseball philosophy and always reminds us that Grand Rapids is a baseball town."

Liebe said, "Bill is an outstanding coach. He keeps us happy and keeps us loose."

Grand Rapids is a good hitting team partly because Kinnunen is skilled in teaching players how to hit. Jake Bischoff came into the State Legion Tournament with a .482 average while Tyrel Cournoyer and Hunter Shepard were hitting .406.

Andrew Geislinger is Grand Rapids' pitching leader with a 5-1 mark and a 2.33 ERA.

Next year, both Carlisle and Liebe will be playing college baseball. Carlisle, a pitcher and outfielder, will play for the University of Minnesota-Duluth, while Liebe, an outfielder, will play for Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minn.

not had a hit in the game. When I got the chance, I made it count."

Gregory led the Silver Stars with a .409 batting average during the regular season. In high school ball at St. Cloud Apollo, he was named St. Cloud Times Player of the Year. He will play at St. Cloud State University next season.

Wood, who will play ball at St. Cloud Technical College next season, is a warrior on the mound. He attacks hitters with a fastball in the high 80s and doesn't give an inch. He knew he would have a challenge on his hands against a Hopkins team with three NCAA Division I signees.

"Hopkins is pretty solid all the way around," he said. "If you throw fastballs over the plate, they'll hit them."

Wood tried to mix it up and his off-speed was effective.

"I was disappointed to give up that run when they tied the score in the top of the ninth," he said. "But I knew we would find a way to win. I was pretty excited when Reese got that hit."

Wood, who is solidly built, said he generates most of his velocity from his legs. He has good stamina, too, and was throwing as hard in the ninth as he did in the first.

"Josh is passionate and works his heart out," said Gregory. "We're a team with good talent and good chemistry. Our defense is solid and we're all good buddies. We have come together as a unit."

In addition to leading the Silver Stars in hitting, Gregory is the pitching leader with a 7-0 record and sterling 1.31 ERA. Wood improved to 5-3 on the mound with Saturday's victory.

Hopkins coach Todd Jahnke said, "It just wasn't meant to be."

"Although it wasn't pretty, the win tonight is probably the most significant win in the history of the Burnsville Legion program," said Nesbitt. "Bo is a big-game type of player. He got ahead of the hitters right away. The last two games, our pitchers have been very efficient. Tyler Hanson shut out Eden Prairie [6-0] with a two-hitter and struck out 12 Friday, and Bo got the shutout today. It is huge when you're throwing complete games in the tournament."

With 13 seniors and college freshmen,

Nesbitt has the kind of veteran team that won't get rattled in tough situations.

"Depth-wise this might be the best team we've had," he said. "And our pitching staff is right up there with the best we've had."

Nesbitt, 33, said that tough competition in Third District D League play, helped prepare the Cobras for the rigors of state. "Look at the teams in our league," he said. "We battled Eastview all summer, and by the end of the season both teams were exhausted."

Earning his 200th career Legion win earlier this season, Nesbitt hopes for a lot of good

years in the future.

"I have been very fortunate to coach the quality kids we have had in our program," he said.

Burnsville was ranked first in the state Legion poll most of the year, but relinquished the top spot to Eastview in the final week.

In the winners' bracket final against Edina, the Cobras will face a team that tied Eden Prairie and Excelsior for the South Hennepin League championship. Edina played a nearly flawless game Saturday, beating Lakeville North 11-1.
