After all, the Red averaged 6.25 runs per game and was never shut out in district play heading into the North End tilt. But on this night it would prove tough to put hits on the board. In fact, the Red was held hitless until Brian Marshik reached on an infield single in the fourth. Not only did Paitich score the game-winning run, he also earned the win on the mound while retiring seven in a row to finish off his four-inning relief stint. After being shutout the day before for the first time this summer in district play, the Red (28-10, 15-3) was in desperate need of something positive to ride into the postseason.

They got it with a workman-like 7-4 win over Rosetown (15-11, 11-7).

The July 27 match up at Irondale was the regular season finale for both teams and each already knew their playoff schedule. Despite that, there was still something on the line as Rosetown was the only team to gain a split with the Red this summer. Early on, they looked like they were determined to capture the three-game season series by scoring twice in the first inning, with the help of chaotic defense by the Red.

The home team cut the lead in half in the bottom of the frame before taking control with multiple home plate touches in the next three innings. Tied 2-2, Blake Searles put the Red in front for good with the second of his three hits, a two-out RBI single to right in the second inning. Also with one hit apiece in the game: Nick Colwell, Brandon Porten, Jake Lechner, Luke Ross (2B) and Brian Marshik.

On the mound, the Red continued the turnstile rotation in preparation for the playoffs by sending out four hurlers: Brandon Porten (3-IP, 3-H, 2-R, 0-ER, 1-SO), Nick Colwell (1-IP, 1-H, 0-R), Erik Fiegel (2-IP, 1-H, 2-R, 0-ER, 1-SO) and Brock Pedersen (1-IP, 0-H, 0-R). Colwell earned the win, his second in three days and Pedersen picked up his first save. The game was full of defensive gems including fantastic catches by outfielders Marshik and Ross along with the fine effort put in by David Norgard. A late reliever all season, Norgard made an appearance in the seventh at first base for the first time this summer and made all three put-outs.

But the fact remains the Red finished the season with three losses in their last six district tilts.

"I think everybody kind of goes through a slump and I think the kids were really pressing," said manager Jeff Larsen. "I think they were a little upset they were popping the ball up and making a lot of bad outs."

Two of the losses were by a run and the other, two runs. "I told them last night it wasn't so bad the way I look at it [loss to North End]. You look up there and it's still 1-0. We had a chance. That tells you they do play pretty good. They were right there in each game," Larsen said. "It's better to get it out of the way than wait for it to happen in the playoffs."

Against Rosetown, the Red couldn't have asked for a better showing heading into the postseason. "I think tonight they pulled out of it," Larsen said. "That last win is important for any club and they'll come to practice tomorrow with a smile on their faces.
